SEA Statement on Doxxing, Threats Against Public Officials

WASHINGTON, DC – Today, Marcus Hill, President of the Senior Executives Association (SEA)—representing the interests of over 10,000 career federal executives in the Senior Executive Service (SES), Senior Level (SL), Scientific and Professional (ST) and equivalent positions and other senior career federal leaders, - released the following statement in response to increased reports of threats against public officials, including doxing:

"The Senior Executives Association (SEA) condemns the doxxing of public servants—whether career or political—by anyone, from any quarter. Anyone who raises their hand and swears the Oath of Office should be able to perform their essential public service absent the threat of intimidation and fear. *Doxxing* is the publication or amplification of an individual's personal information (such as home address or family details) with the intent or reasonably foreseeable effect of harassment or harm. It has no place in a democratic society."
