SEA Reacts to Biden Administration’s Move to Mandate Vaccination Across the Federal Workforce

WASHINGTON, DC – Today, Bob Corsi President of the Senior Executives Association (SEA) – the leading professional association responsible for representing, convening, and cultivating members of the Senior Executive Service (SES) and senior career leaders across the federal government – released the following statement on President Biden’s upcoming executive order mandating vaccination across the federal workforce:

“The Senior Executives Association fully supports President Biden’s action to mandate COVID-19 vaccinations across the federal workforce. Getting vaccinated is the surest way to protect the health and welfare of oneself and others, to include colleagues in the workplace. Vaccinations have been deemed to be effective in mitigating COVID-19 related hospitalizations and deaths. By mandating their use, the federal government is leading, by setting a strong example for other organizations and industry to model,” Corsi said.

“We strongly encourage the Administration to ensure appropriate exemptions, such as medical and religious, exist for those who require them. In addition, SEA continues to stress the importance of the Administration and Congress providing the federal agencies with the resources and latitude necessary to protect their workforces from this dreadful virus. We look forward to working with the COVID-19 Safer Federal Workforce Task Force to ensure vaccines are available to all federal employees,” Corsi concluded.
